Developing a culture of compassion, empathy, respect and ethical behaviour within a school environment provides an expectation that students in their digital worlds exhibit the values embedded in this culture. Through education, students will be empowered by a deeper understanding of the universal rules of social conduct, which benefits them beyond the physical or virtual spaces in which they live, learn and play. To ensure that students gain the knowledge, skills and values to independently make respectful, safe and responsible choices in a digitally connected environment, schools are required to develop a sustained awareness and education strategy. This keynote address explores current digital citizenship issues, research and resources.
